Regular Meeting 9 August 2011

The Supervisors of Ligonier Township met in regular session with Timothy Komar and William C. Penrod, Jr. present, Keith Whipkey was absent.. Supervisor Penrod brought the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Audience Participation - None

A motion was made by Komar and seconded by Penrod to approve the minutes of the 12 July special meeting. Motion carried.

Ken Tomajko of Arborel Tree Service in Pittsburgh was not present to give his presentation on the Emerald Ash Bore.

An inter-municipal agreement with Ligonier Borough was discussed by the Board and Solicitor Ciszek was authorized on a motion by Komar, seconded by Penrod to proceed with an update or draft of an ordinance to support the agreement for the September 2011 meeting. It was discussed

that this ordinance would outline the procedures, responsibilities for shared services between the Township and the Borough.

Supervisor Komar reminded the public that the road crews would begin tarring and chipping road maintenance at the end of August. He also warned that the act of discharging mower clippings and yard debris onto the roadways is illegal and that homeowners could be cited for doing so. He also stated that the crews having to clean up the roadways of this debris before they begin the road maintenance only adds more cost to the taxpayers.

Being no further business before the Board and upon a motion by Penrod, seconded by Komar, the meeting was adjourned at 7:11 pm. Motion carried.
